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Purpose of the Feeding Florida Report

For 30 years, Florida Impact's network of leaders has successfully removed barriers to and increased funding for federal food and nutrition programs. For example, the Florida Legislature's 2005 passage of the Willie Ann Glenn Act moved *many* counties in Florida to open new sites and *all* counties to keep them open longer. Shortly after, the U.S. Congress' expansion of the Simplified Summer Food Program streamlined the program's operation for sponsors. Yet still there remain literally millions in federal summer nutrition dollars for Florida, if we could only get more children to the sites! This is true for virtually all the federal food and nutrition programs and the reason why Impact also works at the community level to ensure these programs are maximized on the ground.

This report outlines how well each of Florida's 67 counties are utilizing the federal food and nutrition programs and the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). The county pages list the rate of participation among those eligible for each program and highlight the opportunity for more funding if each program were meeting more of the need. The following table details just how much in potential funding for only four of the federal nutrition programs fails to reach each county.

Federal Tools for Fighting Hunger and Addressing Poverty

Earned Income Tax Credit

The Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) is a refundable federal income tax credit for low to moderate income working individuals and families. When the EITC exceeds the amount of taxes owed, it results in a tax refund to workers who meet certain criteria and who file a tax return to claim the credit, even if a worker did not earn enough money to be obligated to file a tax return. Workers may be able to claim the credit retroactively for the last few years. Working families with children having annual incomes below \$34,000 to \$41,000 (varying for marital status and the number of children) are generally eligible for the EITC. A single worker without children having an annual income below \$13,000, or married workers with an annual income of less than \$16,000, can receive a smaller EITC.

The Center on Budget and Policy Priorities (CBPP) reports that in 2005, the EITC pulled 2.6 million children out of poverty; without the EITC, the poverty rate among children would have been one-fourth higher. Based on this statistic, the EITC lifts more children out of poverty nationally than any other federally-funded program. Still, the IRS national estimate is that 20% of workers eligible to claim the credit do not apply. In Florida, over 400,000 eligible workers did not claim the EITC for Tax Year 2006. (Tax year 2006 is defined by tax returns filed in 2007 with refunds received in 2007.) During this time, the IRS reports the maximum EITC was \$4,536 with two or more qualifying children, \$2,747 with one qualifying child, or \$412 with no qualifying children. In Florida, the average federal EITC received in Tax Year 2006 was \$2,062.72. The EITC can represent up to 40 percent of a workers annual income.

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children

The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) is a federally funded preventive nutrition program created in 1974 in response to the knowledge that inadequate nutrition poses real dangers to pregnant women, new mothers, infants, and children under five. WIC provides access to supplemental foods, which are purchased with vouchers, that are rich in protein, iron, calcium, vitamins A and C, and folic acid. These are all key nutrients for the health of women and children that are often lacking

in the diets of low-income people. WIC also provides nutrition counseling, nutrition education, and health care access.



Research continually shows that good nutrition during pregnancy and early childhood has a positive impact on health and development. WIC children enter school ready to learn and have better cognitive performance. In addition, WIC increases birth weight and decreases neonatal deaths and premature infants. Unlike many of the other programs in this report, WIC does not enjoy “entitlement” status, which means that not everyone who qualifies under the program’s rules can receive benefits. However, Florida is now serving over 80% of the estimated eligible population, and participation is at nearly 500,000 as reported for September 2008.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (formerly the Food Stamp Program)

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), previously known as “The Food Stamp Program” and commonly known in Florida as the “Food Assistance Program”, is one of the most important national defenses against hunger. SNAP provides benefits on an electronic benefit transfer (EBT) card which can be used to buy food at authorized grocery stores, ultimately allowing low-income households

to obtain a nutritious diet. In addition, these benefits help hardworking people stretch their monthly income by freeing up resources, so families do not have to make choices between buying food or paying rent, or between feeding their children and getting access to medical care. While helping to combat food insecurity, supplemental nutrition assistance also brings in federal dollars to boost state and local economies.

The Center on Budget and Policy Priorities estimates that more than 75 percent of SNAP participants are families with children. In FY07-08, over 700,000 unique households on average received SNAP benefits. In fact, over \$1.6 billion was issued to Florida SNAP recipients during this time. Such a large multiplier effect generates an important economic stimulus to the state's economy.

National School Lunch Program

The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) was created by Congress in 1946 as a "measure of national security" due to an investigation into the health of young men rejected in the World War II draft that showed a connection between physical deficiencies and childhood malnutrition. Now, through the NSLP, all public and non-profit, private schools receive per-meal cash reimbursements as a federal entitlement, thus providing nutritious meals to the broadest range of American children. School lunch provides school children with one-third or more of their Recommended Dietary Allowance (RDA) for key nutrients; and United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) research indicates that children who participate in this program have superior nutritional intakes compared to those who do not, irrespective of family income.

Free and Reduced-price school meal eligibility is determined based on participation in the NSLP. Children from low-income families are provided meals at a free or reduced rate depending on their income: those at or below 130 percent of the poverty level are eligible for free meals; those with incomes between 130 percent and 185 percent, for reduced-price meals. In the 2007-2008 school year, 50.41% of participating public-school children in Florida qualified for free or reduced-price lunches.

School Breakfast Program

Most schools have recognized for a long time the benefits of serving lunch to students but have been slower to realize the importance of serving breakfast. Created as a pilot in 1966 and first permanently authorized in 1975, the School Breakfast Program (SBP) offers essential support to students. In 1989, Florida Impact was able to get the State of Florida to mandate the School Breakfast Program in all elementary schools. School breakfast is needed as long commuting patterns and varied work schedules mean that many children or parents leave home hours before school starts. A good breakfast is vital for these children to be alert and ready to learn.



According to the Food Research and Action Center, in the 2007-2008 school year Florida was ranked fifth in the nation for its percentage of schools participating in the SBP. Despite this high ranking, of the 1.04 million public-school children who participated in free or reduced-price lunch in 2007-08, only 470,834 also participated in school breakfast. This means that 55% of eligible students in Florida public schools are not participating in breakfast.

Summer Food Service Program

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) was established by Congress in 1968 to provide meals to children ages 18 and younger when schools are closed during the summer months. Operated nationally by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and administered in Florida by the Department of Education, the summer nutrition programs can be run by schools, parks, churches, community centers, and other nonprofit organizations. Summer meals serve as the anchor around which summer education, literacy, recreation, violence prevention, and other enrichment activities are built. SFSP maintains nutritional continuity for hungry children, strengthens public and private non-profit summer programs, and assists the healthy growth and development of low-income children, ensuring they are ready to learn in the new school year.



In the Summer of 2008, an average of 149,599 kids in Florida participated daily in the SFSP at a total of 2,805 sites statewide. This equates to only 12% participation from potentially eligible kids. To help increase these numbers, in the Summer of 2009 Florida Impact launched a Summer Food Service Program website, www.summerfoodflorida.org. This website enables parents, students, and community members to find out more information about the program and to easily locate a SFSP site nearest them. By mid-June of 2009, after only two weeks of operation, the website already had over 1,600 visitors.

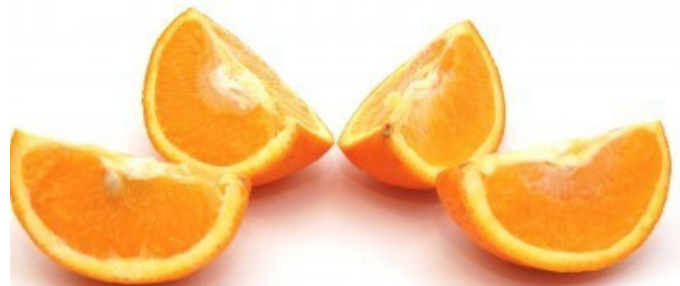
School-Based Afterschool Snack

In 1998, the U.S. Congress expanded the NSLP to include reimbursements for School-based Afterschool Snack. The purpose of the snack program is to offer cash

reimbursement to schools serving snacks to children ages 18 and under involved in afterschool educational or enrichment activities. To receive reimbursements, a school must provide children with regularly scheduled afterschool activities in an organized, structured, and supervised environment. School-based afterschool snack helps keep hunger away so children can fully participate in educational activities that keep them safe and active while their parents are at work.

Community-Based Afterschool Snack

For non-school organizations that run educational or enrichment-based afterschool programs, reimbursement for snacks (for children 18 and under) and meals (for children 12 and under) is provided under the federally run Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP). Through the CACFP, each day thousands of children receive nutritious meals and snacks through Florida daycares, Head Start programs, family childcare homes, homeless and domestic violence shelters, and community-based afterschool programs. The program also provides meals to Floridians who receive care in nonresidential adult daycare centers.

ENDNOTES

General Note: The Feeding Florida 2009 Report contains data gathered for all 67 Florida counties. Data reported for school-based programs (Free and Reduce-priced School Meal Eligibility, School Breakfast Program, Summer Food Service Program, School-based After School Snack), on both the county and state levels, are based on numbers for the 67 school districts only and do NOT include numbers from any state-administered university schools, private nonprofit/church schools, or other government run institutions.

Food Insecurity

The majority of households in the United States have dependable and constant access to food. However, a certain percentage of our population are considered to be “food insecure”, which means a household’s access to adequate food is limited by lack of money or lack of other necessary resources. Since 1995, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has collected information annually on food spending, food access and adequacy, and sources of food assistance for the U.S. population. A major impetus for this data collection is to provide information about the prevalence and severity of food insecurity in U.S. households, and to guide planning for Federal, State, and community-based food assistance programs. Once complete, the USDA issues an annual report entitled, “Household Food Security in the United States”; the 2007 edition can be found online at www.ers.usda.gov/publications/err66/.

This report has calculated the Food Insecurity (the percentage of all households potentially food insecure) for each Florida county based on the USDA reported Food Insecurity percentage for the State of Florida. The Community Childhood Hunger Identification Project, one of the pioneer studies on hunger in America and forerunner to the USDA food security measure, used race, number of children, family income, and urban/rural residence as predictors of childhood hunger. Of the four, family income, measured as a percentage of the poverty level, was found to be the single most useful characteristic for predicting whether a family would be hungry or not. The Feeding Florida uses poverty as a predictor of food insecurity, calculating Florida’s reported ratio of food insecurity (12.4%) to its statewide poverty rate (12.1%) to get a statewide food insecurity factor of .975. This food insecurity factor is then multiplied by each county’s poverty rate to determine the percent of all households potentially food insecure for that particular county. Therefore: county-level food insecurity = (county poverty rate¹) x (statewide food insecurity² / statewide poverty rate³)

Demographics

Population data was gathered from the U.S. Census Bureau file “Table 1: Annual Estimates of the Population for Counties of Florida: April 1, 2000 to July 1, 2007”⁴, and were reported using the July 1, 2007 estimates for each Florida county. Per Capita Income (2006) is the total income of all persons over 15 years of age in a given area divided by the total population in a given area. Feeding Florida used data from the US Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis, Regional Economic Accounts, Table: “Personal Income and Per Capita Personal Income by County for Florida 2004-2006”⁵. This table was computed using Census Bureau midyear population estimates.

The remaining demographic categories, including Poverty Rate, Number of People in Poverty, and Number of Children Under 18 in Poverty, were all gathered from the “USDA 2007 County-Level Poverty Rate for Florida”⁶, a compilation of information from the Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE)⁷ data reported by the U.S. Census Bureau and other Federal agencies. SAIPE was created to provide more current estimates of selected income and poverty statistics than the most recent decennial census. Unlike the household poverty numbers used to calculate food insecurity in this report, only demographic data for individuals is given in the SAIPE estimates shown here. These estimates are based on statistical models that use decennial census data, household survey data, administrative records data, and population estimates. Since these are statistical estimates, some reasonable error is assumed; therefore, estimates will not be exactly equal to the “true” median income or “true” poverty numbers or rates. Such “true” values are generally impossible to determine. For purposes of the Feeding Florida report, all data is the official SAIPE estimate - no data from the SAIPE upper or lower bounds was reported.

Earned Income Tax Credit

The Number of EITC Claims Receiving a Refund was gathered using the EITC Interactive⁸ tool offered by the Brookings Institution⁹, a nonprofit public policy organization conducting high-quality, independent research on various social welfare and security initiatives. The Average EITC received was calculated by dividing the total sum of EITC received in the county, also provided by Brookings, by the number of EITC Claims Receiving a Refund.

The other two reported data were formulated using guidelines provided by John Wanchek with the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities¹⁰ using numbers provided by the Brookings EITC Interactive Tool. The Internal Revenue Service's (IRS) national estimate is that about 20% of those eligible to claim EITC do not. Therefore, to get the Estimated Number of Persons Not Participating simply multiple the total number of EITC claims by (1/0.8). The IRS reports that workers who are eligible, but NOT claiming the EITC, are generally lower-income, childless workers who will be reimbursed with lower EITC benefits.¹¹ Therefore, to calculate the estimated unused federal dollars, multiply the number of estimated eligible workers not participating by 75% of the average EITC claim – this provides a conservative estimate to the amount of unused federal funds.

At the time of this publication, the most up-to-date EITC information provided by Brookings were Tax Year 2006 numbers, where Tax Year 2006 is defined by tax returns filed in 2007 with refunds received in 2007. Therefore, Tax Year 2006 monies are being used to stimulate the economy upfront in the year 2007.

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)

All of the reported WIC data was provided by Mary Ann Patterson with the Florida Department of Health (DOH), Bureau of WIC and Nutrition Services. WIC Participation reflects the number of women, infants, and children enrolled in WIC, based on their county of residence, for the month of September 2008. The data in September has been found to best represent the annual participation for WIC services, and is less influenced by clients receiving services in other counties besides their own. DOH estimates the Number of Potentially Eligible Persons in County based on figures including live birth statistics, population projections, and by applying the county poverty factor; since these are just estimates, some reasonable error is assumed. The Estimated Percent of Eligible Persons Participating is simply the ratio of Participation to Number of Potentially Eligible Persons in the County. When WIC participants receive services in other counties, the Estimated Percent of Eligible Persons Participating may be over 100 percent because the county participation reported could potentially be higher than the actual number of eligible persons in that county; for the purposes of the Feeding Florida report, this number has been capped at 100 percent, should any results exceed that percentage.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

The Average Monthly Participants, Average Monthly Number of Households, Average Monthly Benefit per Person, and Total Issuance (Value of Benefits) were gathered from a Caseload Data report¹² provided by Florida Department of Children and Families, Economic Self-Sufficiency Technology Unit¹³ for July 2007 to June 2008. The Estimated Percent of Eligible Persons Participating is the number of Average Monthly Participants divided by the number of estimate eligible persons in the county¹⁴. This is a conservative estimate of eligible persons, as individuals with gross incomes up to 130% of poverty (among other asset limitations) are potentially eligible.

To report the Estimated Unused Federal Dollars for the year, the Average Monthly Benefit per Person was multiplied by 12 months (to get an average annual sum per person), and the resulting product was then multiplied by an estimated number of people who are eligible but who are NOT participating in the program¹⁵.

Free and Reduced-Price Eligibility

All data was provided by Amy White with the Florida Department of Education, Food and Nutrition Management. The data is from the 2007-2008 school year Survey 3, a week long survey (generally in February) required of all state schools (public, private, home-schools) to evaluate various components including number of enrolled students, Limited English proficient status, and free and reduced-price lunch status. As mentioned in the "General Note" provided on page 78, both the county-level and state-level numbers are based on estimates from public school district sources only. These numbers do not include Provision 2 eligibility.

School Breakfast Program (SBP)

The majority of School Breakfast Program (SBP) data is viewable in the Florida Department of Education Child Nutrition Program CORE database¹⁶ using the “NsIRpt1000” report. Respectively, Free ADP, Reduced-price ADP, and Paid ADP are the total number of free, reduced-price, and paid breakfasts served per county during the school year, divided by 180¹⁷. The Total Average Daily Participation (ADP) is simply the sum of the Free ADP, Reduced-price ADP, and Paid ADP. To calculate the Estimated Percent of FRP Eligibles Participating, take the sum of Free ADP + Reduced-price ADP, and divide this sum by the number of FRP **students reported in Survey 3**¹⁸. Then **multiple this** number by 100 to obtain the percentage.

The formula used to find the Estimated Unused Federal Dollars is the following: [$\$1.35$ free reimbursement rate¹⁹ x average number of free eligibles NOT participating daily²⁰ x 180 school days] + [$\$1.05$ reduced-price reimbursement x average number of reduced-price eligibles NOT participating daily²¹ x 180 school days]

Summer Food Service Programs (SFSP)

In the Feeding Florida report, Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) includes data for two summer feeding options operated by the Florida Department of Education. The first program is the “official” SFSP, which all non-profit sponsors and most schools choose to operate. The second program is the Summer Seamless Option²² which reduces the paperwork and administrative burden on school districts; in return for these lessened burdens, schools receive a reimbursement rate for summer meals that is equivalent to the reimbursement rate they receive during the normal school year. This school year reimbursement is less than reimbursement they might otherwise receive during the summer months.²³ Therefore, schools opting to participate in the Summer Seamless Option are rewarded with less paperwork, but receive a lower rate of reimbursement. This Report combines totals from both summer feeding programs and categorizes them both under the heading of “Summer Food Service Program”.

Like the School Breakfast Program data, nearly all of the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) data is viewable in the Florida Department of Education Child Nutrition Program CORE database. The Number of Sites and Number of Sponsors are taken from reports “SfsRpt2004”, “Sws1003”, and “SfsRpt2000”. If the County School District or School Board is a sponsor this is reported as an asterisk in the Feeding Florida data. The Total Average Daily Participation (ADP) was determined from report “Sfsrpt2004”. This number is based only on the number of lunches served and does NOT include the number of breakfasts, suppers, or snacks served. The Estimated Percent of Eligibles Participating is the Total Average Daily Participation divided by the total number of estimated FRP eligibles per county. To calculate the Estimated Unused Federal Dollars, the amount of current reimbursement received by each county was subtracted from the estimated potential unused federal dollars per county. The estimated potential unused federal dollars was determined by the following formula: [(number of FRP eligibles) x (35 summer days²⁴) x (\$2.9875 reimbursement rate²⁵)].

The reported data may not capture SFSP lunches served to children in a particular county if the program serving the meals is sponsored by a school/organization from outside the county. Instead, these lunches will be reported for the county that the sponsor is located in.

School-Based After School Snack

School-Based After School Snack data is viewable on the Florida Department of Education Child Nutrition Program CORE database using report “NsIRpt1009”. This report gives the total number of snacks served. To get the Average Daily Participation numbers, simply divide the number of snacks served for each category (Free, Reduced-price, and Paid) by 180 school days.

Community-Based Afterschool Snack

All data was provided by Ellen Farrell and Dean Carlson with the Florida Department of Health, Child Care Food Program. The reported data may not capture all snacks served to children in a particular county if the program serving the meals is sponsored by an organization from outside the county. Instead, these snacks will be reported for the county that the sponsor is located in.
